The purpose of E-S BEST is to connect Environment-Stewardship (E-S) business line budget package program performance. E-S BEST is a web-based tool developed for field use in calculating Environment performance measure outputs for O&M activities. The system is implemented in four stages.

Project summary

The south shoreline of White Lake had been retreating at an estimated average of 15 feet per year as a result of wind-driven energy. Continued south shoreline erosion would have likely breached low marsh management levees and increased interior marsh loss rates in this area. A segmented rock breakwater (sometimes called a foreshore dike) was constructed in shallow water parallel to the shoreline. Due to soft, organic shoreline material, the rock was placed on geotextile fabric and is expected to experience settlement; future maintenance lifts of additional stone are planned.


