With the exception of the changes below, all terms and conditions of the Colorado Plateau CESU Agreement apply to this Amendment, and this Amendment is hereby made part of the Agreement.

ARTICLE I. BACKGROUND AND OBJECTIVES

- A.1. The Western Area Power Administration is hereby included in the Colorado Plateau CESU as a Federal Agency Partner.
- O. Western Area Power Administration. Congress established the Western Area Power Administration (hereinafter called WAPA) in 1977. WAPA is a Power Marketing Administration within the United States Department of Energy. WAPA's mission is to safely provide reliable, cost-based hydropower and transmission to its customers and the communities it serves, which includes approximately 700 customers who in turn provide power to about 40 million

Americans across 15 western states. Specifically, WAPA markets over 10,000 megawatts of power from 57 dams, operates and maintains over 17,000 miles of transmission lines with associated infrastructure (e.g., 291 transformers, 324 substations, 489 communication sites, and 661 buildings), access roads, and rights-of-way, and facilitates renewable projects with a nexus within its geographic footprint via independent borrowing authority. WAPA undertakes design, engineering, construction, operation, maintenance, education, interpretation, inventory, monitoring, ecological restoration, and biological and cultural resource stewardship activities in the context of fulfilling its mission to market and deliver clean, renewable, reliable, cost-based Federal hydroelectric power and related services. WAPA's statutory authority to enter into this cooperative agreement is provided in Public Law 95-91, U.S. Department of Energy Organization Act (i.e., Section 646; 42 U.S.C. § 7256). WAPA is thereby authorized to enter into this Agreement to continue the Colorado Plateau CESU to assist in providing research, technical assistance and education.

ARTICLE III. TERM OF AGREEMENT

- A.1. The effective date of the Colorado Plateau CESU Cooperative and Joint Venture Agreement is 18 June 2019.
- A.2. The effective date of this Amendment to the Colorado Plateau CESU Cooperative and Joint Venture Agreement shall be determined from the date of the last signature to this Amendment.
