With the exception of the changes below, all terms and conditions of the Desert Southwest CESU Cooperative and Joint Venture Agreement apply to this Amendment, and this Amendment is hereby made part of the Agreement.

ARTICLE I. BACKGROUND AND OBJECTIVES

- A.1. The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service is hereby included in the Desert Southwest Cooperative Ecosystem Studies Unit as a Federal Agency Partner under agreement F11AC00404.
- M. The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (hereinafter called USFWS) working with others, is responsible for conserving, protecting, and enhancing fish, wildlife, plants and their habitats for the continuing benefit of the American people through Federal programs related to migratory birds, endangered species, interjurisdictional fish and marine mammals, and inland sport fisheries. In accordance with the Fish and Wildlife Act of 1956 (16 USC 742f), the USFWS is authorized to enter into this cooperative agreement to continue the Desert Southwest CESU to assist in providing research, technical assistance, and education.

ARTICLE III. TERM OF THE AGREEMENT

- A.1. The effective date of the Desert Southwest CESU Cooperative and Joint Venture agreement is 07 October 2010.
- A.3. The effective date of this amendment to the Desert Southwest CESU Cooperative and Joint Venture agreement shall be determined from the date of the last signature.
