With the exception of the changes below, all terms and conditions of the Gulf Coast CESU Cooperative and Joint Venture Agreement apply to this Amendment, and this Amendment is hereby made part of the Agreement.

ARTICLE I. BACKGROUND AND OBJECTIVES

- A.1. The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service is hereby included in the Gulf Coast CESU as a Federal Agency partner under U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service Agreement #81332 8 J019.
- K.1. Effective with this Amendment, the name on record for the Gulf Coast CESU Host University — Texas Agricultural Experiment Station, Texas A&M System — is hereby replaced with: Texas Agricultural Experiment Station – d.b.a. Texas AgriLife Research.
- L. The partner institutions to the Host University (hereinafter called Partner Institutions) include Auburn University, Louisiana State University, Mississippi State University, Texas A&M-Corpus Christi, Texas A&M-Galveston, Texas A&M-Kingsville, Troy University, University of Central Florida, University of Florida, University of Georgia Research Foundation, Inc., University of Louisiana at Lafayette, University of Texas-Austin, The Nature Conservancy of Texas, Stephen F. Austin State University, University of New Orleans, The University of West Florida, Tarleton State University, Sul Ross State University, University of Arkansas at Monticello, University of Arkansas Division of Agriculture, Houston Advanced Research Center (HARC), and Southern University and A&M College.

- L.1. Bat Conservation International is hereby included in the Gulf Coast CESU as a Partner Institution.
- M. The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (hereinafter called USFWS), working with others, is responsible for conserving, protecting, and enhancing fish, wildlife, plants and their habitats for the continuing benefit of the American people through Federal programs related to migratory birds, endangered species, interjurisdictional fish and marine mammals, and inland sport fisheries. In accordance with 16 U.S.C. 742f, the USFWS is authorized to enter into this cooperative agreement continuing the Gulf Coast CESU to assist in providing research, technical assistance, and education.

ARTICLE III. TERM OF AGREEMENT

- A.1. The effective date of the Gulf Coast CESU Cooperative and Joint Venture Agreement is 2 August 2007.
- A.2. The effective date of this Amendment to the Gulf Coast CESU Cooperative and Joint Venture Agreement shall be determined from the date of the last signature to this Amendment.
