With the exception of the changes below, all terms and conditions of the North Atlantic Coast CESU Agreement apply to this Amendment, and this Amendment is hereby made part of the Agreement.

ARTICLE I. BACKGROUND AND OBJECTIVES

- A.2. The Bureau of Ocean Energy Management, Regulation and Enforcement (formerly Minerals Management Service) is hereby included in the North Atlantic Coast CESU as a Federal Agency Partner.
- I.2. The Provincetown Center for Coastal Studies and Cornell University are hereby included in the North Atlantic Coast CESU as a Partner Institutions.
- K. Department of the Interior (DOI) Secretarial Order No. 3071 established the Minerals Management Service in 1982 with responsibility for managing the Nation's oil. natural gas, and other mineral resources on the Federal Outer Continental Shelf (OCS) and the mineral revenues from OCS, Federal, and Indian lands as authorized by the OCS Lands Act (OCSLA) (43 USC 1331-1356). Pursuant to DOI Secretarial Order No. 3302 (18 June 2010), the Minerals Management Service was renamed the Bureau of Ocean Energy Management, Regulation and Enforcement (hereafter BOEMRE). The BOEMRE manages the mineral resources on 1.7 billion acres of the OCS to ensure that the U.S. government receives fair market value for acreage made available for leasing and manages any oil and gas activities to conserve resources, operate safely, and protect the coastal and marine environment. In addition to OCSLA, numerous laws, but particularly NEPA, provide the basis for environmental assessment and study of impacts associated with OCS related activities. OCSLA Section 1346 mandates the conduct of environmental and socioeconomic studies needed for the assessment and management of environmental impacts on the human, marine, and coastal environments which may be affected by oil and gas or other mineral development. It further states that the Secretary may by agreement utilize, with or without reimbursement, the services, personnel, or facilities of any Federal, State, or local government agency. OCSLA Section 1345 authorizes the use of cooperative agreements with affected States to meet the requirements of OCSLA, including sharing of information, joint utilization of available expertise, formation of joint monitoring arrangements to carry out applicable Federal and State laws, regulations, and stipulations relevant to outer Continental Shelf operations both onshore and offshore. The Energy Policy Act of 2005 amended the OCS Lands Act to give authority to the Department of the Interior to coordinate the development of an alternative energy program on the OCS and

also to coordinate the energy and non-energy related uses in areas of the OCS where traditional oil and natural gas development already occurs. BOEMRE may use, as appropriate, the aforementioned authorities for specific activities under this agreement and to enter into this cooperative agreement continuing the North Atlantic Coast CESU to assist in providing research, technical assistance and educational services.

ARTICLE III. TERM OF AGREEMENT

- A.1. The effective date of the North Atlantic Coast CESU Cooperative Agreement is 19 June 2009.
- A.2. The effective date of this amendment to the North Atlantic Coast CESU Cooperative Agreement shall be determined from the date of the last signature.

ARTICLE V. AWARD

A.1. Upon signature of all parties to this amendment, the Bureau of Ocean Energy Management, Regulation and Enforcement will commit \$10,000 in funds to the Host University in furtherance of the Agreement, to be authorized by a modification issued against the Agreement.

ARTICLE X. REQUIRED/SPECIAL PROVISIONS

The following provisions are hereby made part of the North Atlantic Coast CESU Agreement.

A. REQUIRED PROVISIONS:

8. PROHIBITION ON TEXT MESSAGING AND USING ELECTRONIC EQUIPMENT SUPPLIED BY THE GOVERNMENT WHILE DRIVING (Included pursuant to Department of the Interior Guidance Release – DIG-2010-04 and USDA Regulation 5400-007)

Executive Order 13513, "Federal Leadership on Reducing Text Messaging While Driving," was signed by President Barack Obama on October 1, 2009

(http://edocket.access.gpo.gov/2009/pdf/E9-24203.pdf). This Executive Order introduces a Federal Government-wide prohibition on the use of text messaging when driving Government owned, leased or rented vehicles (GOVs), when driving privately owned vehicles (POVs) on official Government business, or when using electronic equipment supplied by the Government while driving. Federal contractors and subcontractors and recipients and subrecipients of grants and cooperative agreements shall adopt and enforce policies that immediately ban text messaging while driving company owned, leased or rented vehicles or GOVs, or when driving personally owned, leased or rented vehicles while on official Government business or when performing any work for or on behalf of the Federal Government.

- 9. CENTRAL CONTRACTOR REGISTRATION AND DATA UNIVERSAL NUMBERING SYSTEM (2 CFR Part 25): 2 CFR Part 170 requires each applicant, as well as recipients and their direct subrecipients, other than individuals, that does not have an exception under 2 CFR §25.110, to:
 - (1) Be registered in the Central Contractor Registration (CCR) database prior to submitting an application or plan;
 - (2) Maintain an active CCR registration with current information at all times during which it has an active Federal award or an application or plan under consideration by an agency; and
 - (3) Provide its Dun and Bradstreet Data Universal Numbering System (DUNS) number in each application or plan it submits to the agency.
- 10. REPORTING SUBAWARDS AND EXECUTIVE COMPENSATION (2 CFR Part 170): 2 CFR Part 170 requires each entity that applies, and does not have an exception under 2 CFR §170.110(b), to ensure they have the necessary processes and systems in place to comply with the reporting requirements of the Federal Funding Accountability and Transparency Act of 2006 (Pub. L. 109–282), as amended by section 6202 of Public Law 110–252, should they receive funding. The following provisions are hereby made part of the North Atlantic Coast CESU Agreement as required by the U.S. Department of the Interior.
